



## Elizabeth Humstone

Elizabeth Humstone, an urban planner with over 35 years experience, is a national expert on smart growth and sprawl development. She is currently a consultant and author on growth management, an advisor to the National Trust for Historic Preservation, and a columnist for *Planning Commissioners' Journal*. Formerly, she was the Executive Director of the Vermont Forum on Sprawl (now Smart Growth Vermont), and the Director of U.S. Programs for the Institute for Sustainable Communities.

Ms. Humstone has worked extensively with communities, states and regions on land planning and development issues. Highlights include her efforts to develop and implement Vermont's successful Downtowns and Growth Centers legislation, coordination of the New England Futures project, and her work on the causes, effects and solutions to sprawl development. Ms. Humstone has lectured extensively on smart growth both within the US and overseas.

In addition to numerous articles in magazines and journals, Ms. Humstone authored with Julie Campoli and Alex MacLean, *Above and Beyond, Visualizing Change in Small Towns and Rural Areas* (Planners Press, 2002). Ms. Humstone is a cum laude graduate of Wheaton College and received her Masters in City Planning from Harvard Graduate School of Design.

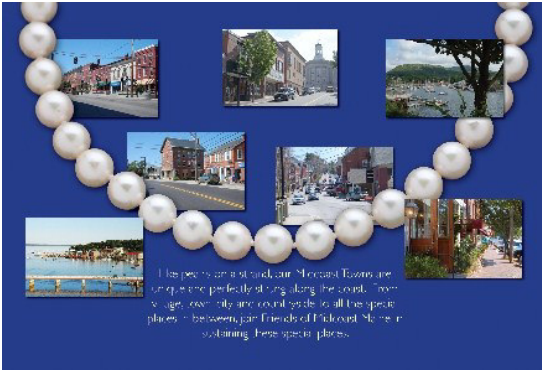
